



# TIPS FOR DRIVERS DURING COVID-19



## KEEPING YOUR VEHICLE CLEAN & READY

**01** Sanitize your vehicle at the end of every day. Wearing disposable gloves, focus on wiping high touch areas (Avoid wipes with bleach or peroxide, as these may damage your interior)

**02** Keep tissues and hand sanitizer in your vehicle

**03** Have a small trash can in your vehicle to dispose of tissues and other trash and help keep your car clean

**04** Keep your vehicle sufficiently fueled

**05** If you are picking up a vehicle from a dealer, make sure to wipe down and sanitize the interior before using it. Similarly, sanitize a vehicle before turning it in

Kiplinger recommends Lysol wipes, their generic equivalent or an alcohol-based product like hand sanitizer. If you can't find those, clean with soap and water, a gentle household cleaner, or car-specific cleaner before wiping down with a disinfectant



## STAYING IN THE KNOW

**01** Make sure you're getting your information about COVID-19 from reliable sources, such as the CDC, Johns Hopkins, or your state's health department

**02** Maintenance facilities and vendors are experiencing very fluid hours. Call ahead to check on hours and appointment availability before going in

**03** Company situations and protocols are changing rapidly, so you may need to reach out while in the field

**04** Keep a flexible mindset. You may need to change your usual routes or routines, and information about processes and protocols might change daily. Being adaptable and responsive to change can help keep you and your customers safe and healthy



## KEEPING YOURSELF & YOUR CUSTOMERS SAFE

**01** When you get home, change clothes and toss them in the laundry

**02** Brush up on your hand washing technique [here](#) and wash frequently

**03** If you are on the road and don't have access to soap and water, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol

**04** If you have passengers, open the windows to increase ventilation when possible

**05** When possible, stay at least six feet away when interacting with customers and wash hands after handling cash

**06** Know the symptoms of COVID-19: fever, cough and shortness of breath. These symptoms can develop anytime from 2-14 days after exposure

**07** If you experience COVID-19 symptoms or come into contact with someone who has a suspected case of COVID-19, comply with your company and state's reporting and testing protocols
